The Department of Computer Science at Colorado State University solicits applications for one or more tenure-track faculty positions at the level of assistant professor, beginning fall 2012. Applicants must have a Ph.D. in computer science or a related field and demonstrate potential for excellence in research, teaching and service. Areas of interest include parallel computing, programming languages that focus on parallel programming models, mobile computing and human computer interaction. An additional area of interest includes bioinformatics/computational biology. Exceptional candidates in other areas will be considered.

The department has over 350 undergraduate majors and 165 graduate students in Master's and Ph.D. programs. The department has 20 tenure-track faculty with strong research programs in artificial intelligence, computer vision, distributed computation, embedded systems, networks, security, and software engineering.
