



## CALL FOR PAPERS

### Third Annual IFIP WG 11.9 International Conference on Digital Forensics

**National Center for Forensic Science  
Orlando, Florida, USA  
January 29-31, 2007**

The *IFIP Working Group 11.9 on Digital Forensics* is an active international community of scientists, engineers and practitioners dedicated to advancing the state of the art of research and practice in the emerging field of digital forensics. The *Third Annual IFIP WG 11.9 International Conference on Digital Forensics* will provide a forum for presenting original, unpublished research results and innovative ideas related to the extraction, analysis and preservation of all forms of electronic evidence. Papers and panel proposals are solicited. All submissions will be refereed by members of Working Group 11.9 and other internationally-recognized experts in digital forensics. Papers and panel submissions will be selected based on their technical merit and relevance to IFIP WG 11.9. The conference will be limited to sixty participants to facilitate interactions between researchers and intense discussions of critical research issues. A selection of papers from the conference will be published in an edited volume – the third in the series entitled *Research Advances in Digital Forensics* (Springer) in the summer of 2007. Revised and/or extended versions of outstanding papers from the conference will be published in a special issue of the journal *Digital Investigations* (Elsevier).

Technical papers are solicited in all areas related to the theory and practice of digital forensics. Areas of special interest include, but are not limited to:

- Theories, techniques and tools for extracting, analyzing and preserving digital evidence
- Operating system and file system forensics
- Network forensics
- Portable electronic device forensics
- Digital forensic processes and workflow models
- Digital forensic case studies
- Legal, ethical and policy issues related to digital forensics

#### Instructions for Authors

**Technical Papers:** Contributions (in .pdf format) should be emailed to the program chair (sujee[at]utulsa.edu). Manuscripts should be in English and not longer than 20 pages (typed double-spaced format in a 12-point font). Each submission should have a cover page with the titles, names and addresses (including e-mail addresses) of authors, an abstract of approximately 200 words, and a list of keywords.

**Panels:** Proposals for panels should be emailed to the program chair (pcraiger[at]mail.ucf.edu). Panel proposals should include a one-page description of the topic, along with the name and address (including e-mail address) of the organizer, and a list of proposed panelists.
